

Here are a few of the clues that the children had to solve today...

Why don't you try and set up an escape room, for a member of your family?

Instructions to help you set up your escape room.

1. Decide on how many clues you are going to create.
2. Write/draw/make the clue.
3. Remember to keep a list of the answers, on a separate piece of paper, as you go.
4. Think of a final task that the contestant will have to complete to escape, with the numbers they have retrieved. For example: place them in order from smallest to largest.
5. Work through the clues yourself, to check they make sense.
6. Set your clues around the escape room. You can add in false clues if you are feeling cheeky and could maybe have some of the clues partially hidden in books/underneath things.
7. Introduce the players to your escape room. Create a story and tell them what they need to do to escape, but don't give any clues away!
8. REMEMBER to have fun & take PHOTOS to share with your Bishop Family! 😊

You could create a board for your contestants to hold up at the end saying, We Escaped in ... Or HELP! We are locked in!

We also used some hidden clues. For example, there was a plain piece of paper and some water colour paints on the other side of the room. Luckily, a couple of children started painting, which revealed a number that we had previously written in crayon. You could change the time on the clock to a certain number. I'm sure you will have lots of amazing ideas!
