Go onto www.themathsfactor.com and complete one challenge a day.	Using your imagination, make up your own story about a mini beast.	Paint some pebbles or rocks and make them into some colourful mini beasts.	Create a poster of different ways you can be kind to someone. E.g. I can share my toys.	Draw the life cycle of a caterpillar and write how it grows. E.g. First, the caterpillar will hatch from its egg.
Draw a symmetrical butterfly. Make sure both sides are the same. Use a mirror to help you.	Pick 5 different high frequency words? Can you spell them independently? E.g. spell; and, to, my, she, the	Create your own shadow puppet show! Make sure your adult takes a video of the show!	Create your own game and play it with your family. Write down the rules so someone else can play it too.	Make a weather chart and record the weather for a week. Write the days of the week on the chart and each day draw a picture to show the weather for that day.
Work out what is 1 less than each number from 1 to 10? E.g., 1 less than 10 is 9.	Find a picture in your favourite book. Can you write three sentences about it? E.g. I like it when the prince finds the princess.	Make a model of a mini beast out of playdough. Write a list of what resources you used. E.g. For my mini beast I used: Playdough Sticks	Tell someone in your family about something you are good at. E.g. I am good at reading because I can 'Fred Talk' the words.	Research and find out what landmarks we have in Newark. Can you draw any? E.g. Newark Castle
Write the numbers 0 – 20. Which numbers are odd and which are even?	Read your reading book to a member of your family. Talk about what you have read.	Create a detailed picture of your garden. You can use paint, crayons, pens or chalk.	Tell an adult about what makes you special. E.g. What makes me special is that I am very helpful with my little sister.	Find out why it is important to recycle and create a poster about it.
Play a game of skittles. How many skittles do you have? How many have you knocked down? How many are left? E.g. I had 10, I knocked down 5 so I have 5 left. $10-5=5$	Practise forming all of your letters correctly then write your full name.	Make a colour-mixing wheel, showing what colours you can make. E.g. Red and yellow makes orange.	Explain to an adult how to cross the road safely and draw a picture to show how. E.g. I must look both ways to see if any cars are driving.	Find a map of England and find Newark on it. Can you read the names of towns and villages around Newark?
