Go onto www.themathsfactor.com and complete 1 challenge a day.	Phonics: Type 'Ruth Miskin training' into YouTube to find daily 'Read Write Inc.' phonics lessons and support.	Go on the internet and find some pictures of old toys. Can you describe how they look different? Can you write a sentence E.g. The old toys had no buttons, My toy is very colourful.	Plan a healthy meal and draw a picture of it. E.g. Chicken, rice and vegetables.	Find a picture of the Artic Circle on the internet and explain to an adult how the environment is different to your garden.
Go on a 3D shape hunt for objects in your house. E.g. a cereal box is a cuboid.	Use objects in your house to spell out your name. E.g. egg for e, vase for v, elephant for e, rope for r, apple for a, teapot for t, trousers for t.	Research what Newark use to look like a long time ago. Write three sentences about what has changed or what has not? E.g. The Castle is still in Newark The market is still in Newark	Explain to a grown up how to wash your hands properly and why it is important.	Use a plastic bottle to make a rain catcher and measure how much rain water you collect in a week.
Cut up a banana into 10 slices and eat 4 of them. How many have you got left?	Get a magazine or book and find all the High Frequency Words you can in it.	Find a baby photograph of you and your adult. Do the photos look different? Why? Write about what you find. E.g. Mummy's photo is in black and white.	Complete a Joe Wicks P.E. Lesson on YouTube.	Go for a walk and draw all the different road signs you see along the way. Can you explain what they mean?
An Ice Lolly in Miss Everatt's shop costs 5p. How many different ways can you use coins to make 5p?	Draw or paint your favourite place. Then try labelling the special things there. E.g. The beach – you could label the sea, sand, donkeys.	Talk to your adult about when they went to school? What was different or the same?	Tell a grown up how to cross the road safely. Use the words 'first', 'then', 'next'.	Get a map out. Can you find Newark? What other places nearby can you find?
Find a timer and count how many star jumps you can do in 30 seconds.	Write a shopping list to help your parents do their weekly shopping E.g. Eggs, cheese, ham etc.	Research houses from a long time ago. How have they changed? Are they better to live in now? Why? E.g. My house has lights inside so I can see when it gets dark.	Write a list of healthy foods you can find in your home. E.g. yellow banana green apple bottle of water etc.	Go for a walk. What different shapes can you find in the environment? E.g. circle road sign square gate
